

Saturday shone bright and sunny. We had our Shannons Show and Shine at Junction Square, in the main street of Wodonga. 32 cars in total were on display.








Monday our competition delegates headed off for their Motorkhana at Jindera, social delegates to Corowa with stops along the way during the day that will be of great interest.
